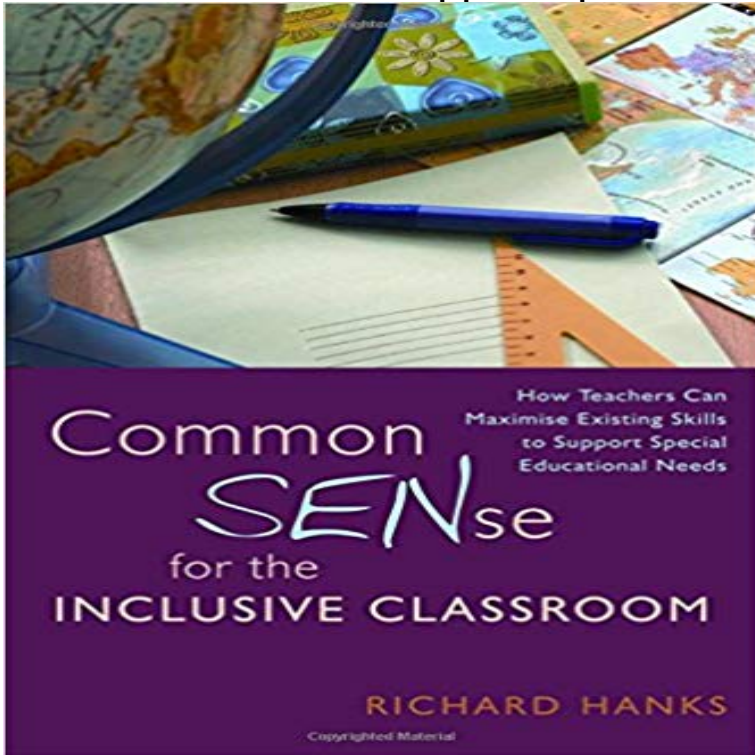


Common SENSE for the Inclusive Classroom: How Teachers Can Maximise Skills to Support Special Education Needs
