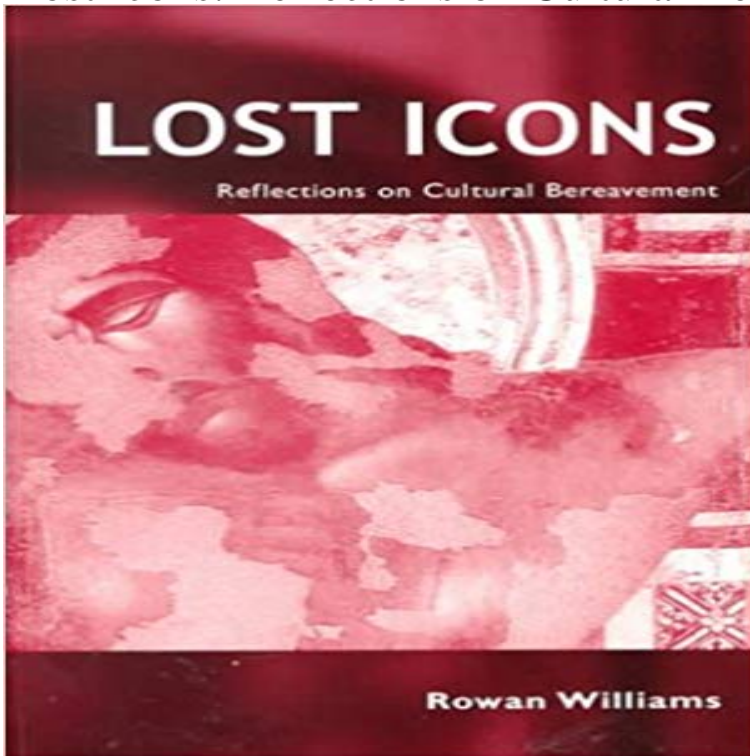


## Lost Icons: Reflections on Cultural Bereavement
